2026 InfraGard National Awards Nominations: Nomination Instructions

The nomination window for the 2026 InfraGard National Awards Program opens on Monday, March 2, 2026, and closes on Sunday, May 31, 2026. Please review the nomination guidelines below in preparation for the 2025 awards cycle. This is an opportunity to acknowledge those who have selflessly volunteered their time and committed efforts during 2025 to contribute to the InfraGard program and to help ensure the success stories of all InfraGard Members Alliances (IMAs).

As established last year, the InfraGard National Awards Program will continue using a tiering system for awards submissions, based on IMA membership size. Previously, awards submissions were categorized and distributed by geographic region, with a total of six regions. The new system replaces the regional categories with six tiers based on IMA membership size. Each IMA has been assigned to a tier, based on the number of members. This new tiering system has the benefit of enabling IMAs to compete in the same tier as other IMAs of similar size. On the following pages, you'll find the IMAs listed by tiers and then by alphabetical order, so you can easily find your tier.

For each award, except for the Linda Franklin National Achievement Memorial Award and the Cross-Sector Council Leadership Award, the Awards Committee will select a winner from each tier, resulting in potentially six recipients for any given award. The prestigious Linda Franklin Award is only given at the national level. The Cross-Sector Council Leadership Award is only awarded to a person working in one of the Cross-Sector Councils.

The recipients of each award (up to 6; one per tier) will be considered finalists for the national award and the Committee will then select the national recipient from those finalists.

Recipients of the IMA Leader of the Year Award will automatically be considered finalists for the national Ivan Wolkind IMA Leader of the Year Award.

Recipients of the FBI Private Sector Coordinator of the Year Award will automatically be considered finalists for the national Daniel Alfin FBI Private Sector Coordinator of the Year Award. There is no need to designate a nomination as being submitted for a tier award or a national award. All nominations will be initially eligible for a national award.

2026 InfraGard National Awards Nominations Guidelines

Opening and closing dates for the nominations period will be provided via an announcement by the Awards Committee Chairperson. Below are the awards nominations guidelines:

1. This Awards cycle covers activities and accomplishments during the 2025 calendar year only.
2. Only InfraGard members may nominate an individual for an award.
3. Each IMA may present only one nomination for each award.
4. Except for the FBI and DHS awards, nominees for individual awards must be InfraGard members.
5. Members of the INMA leadership team (board members and officers) are not eligible for any award while serving and until one year after leaving their position.
6. Members of the Awards Committee are not eligible for any award while serving. Additionally, a past Awards Committee Chair is not eligible for the Linda Franklin Award until one year after leaving the position.
7. Individuals may not be nominated for a specific award if they have been the recipient of that same award, on the national level, in the past three (3) years. Previous regional/tier recipients who were not selected as a national recipient may be nominated.
8. To ensure validity of each nomination, the Awards Committee will contact the appropriate IMA President and FBI Private Sector Coordinator for approval.
9. **Self-nominations are not permitted.**
10. **All criteria fields on the nominations are mandatory.** The system will not accept blank answers or answers with fewer than 10 words.
11. You will have the ability to save a partially completed nomination and receive an email from InfraGard National Awards Program (DoNotReply@infragardnational.org) that will permit you to return and complete it for submission.
12. Upon submission of a nomination, you will receive a confirmation email from InfraGard National Awards Program (DoNotReply@infragardnational.org). You will also receive a PDF copy of your nomination from Awards Chair (AwardsChair@infragardnational.org)

Award Nominating Process

InfraGard National is using Award Force to manage our award nominations and judging. To submit a nomination, you must be a registered user of the Award Force platform. Please click here <https://infragardnational.awardsplatform.com/> to register as an award nominator.

The category pulldown menu contains all the award categories. Please note that the requirements differ for each award. On this page, “Award Candidate” is the name of the person you are nominating for the award. The candidate’s email address, phone number, IMA, and Region (pulldown menu selection) must be entered on this page as well.

Figure 3 is an example of a nomination for the “Meeting the Challenge” award. The award category is selected by pulling down the category menu and clicking on the award name you wish to select. The rest of the entry page is self-explanatory.

When you have filled in all the particulars for the award candidate – select “**Save+next**” at the bottom of the page, and you will be brought to the page shown in Figure 4 Award Criteria and Justification Entry.

The nomination must include specifics (e.g., tasks, initiatives, conferences, seminars, exercises or other efforts) to support each of the criteria that is selected.

Criteria - 1 (optional)	1. Overcame a specific personal or professional challenge, or a challenge within the InfraGard program, in pursuit of advancing the goals of the InfraGard program. Describe the challenge(s).
Criteria - 2 (optional)	2. Maintained a positive "can do" attitude and spirit in the face of the above challenge(s).
Criteria - 3 (optional)	3. Made exemplary contributions that encompass professionalism and dedication in their efforts to overcome the above challenge(s). Write directly benefiting the InfraGard program through training and motivational activities.
Criteria - 4 (optional)	4. Demonstrated the ability to successfully complete an action plan that overcomes challenge(s).
Criteria - 5 (optional)	5. Has shown a spirit of dedication to the InfraGard Mission through personal substantive accomplishments.

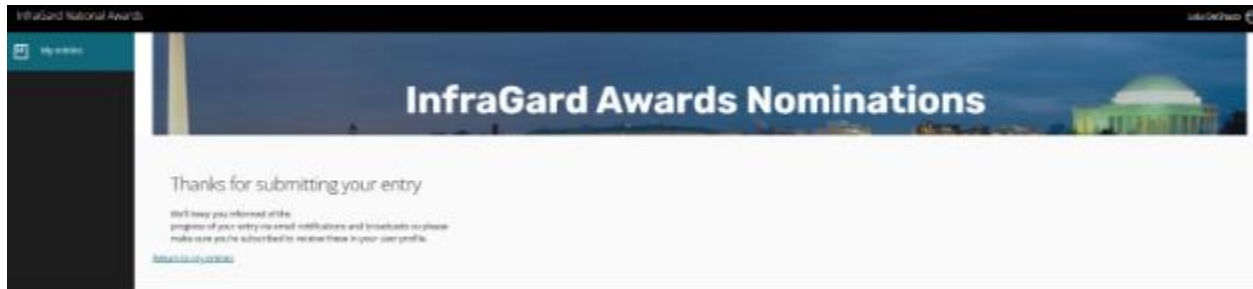


Figure 5 – Post-submission screen

Appendix 1 – Award Description and Criterion

Award Descriptions

Linda Franklin National Achievement Memorial Award

As the highest honor in the InfraGard National Awards Program, the Linda Franklin National Achievement Memorial Award acknowledges an individual who has made a profound and enduring impact on the InfraGard program. Receiving this award is a testament to an individual's dedication, hard work, and talent, and it serves as a powerful recognition of their contributions. Nominations must describe how the nominee has demonstrated a long track record of significant and lasting contributions, and spirit of service and dedication to the InfraGard program. The nomination must include measurable specifics (e.g., type/number of programs, initiatives, events, members served, or other efforts) to support the criteria.

Note: The Linda Franklin National Achievement Memorial Award is only given to one national winner. There are no tier winners.

Eligibility: Nominees must have a minimum of seven years of distinguished service to the InfraGard program, with measurable contributions at both the **local AND national level**. Nominees can include general InfraGard members, FBI personnel, IMA leaders, or INMA leaders. Please note that INMA board members and officers are not eligible for any award while currently serving until one year after leaving their position.

1. Please chronicle the nominee's history and role within the InfraGard program, to include number of years in the program.
2. Please provide specific examples (programs, events, initiatives, or other efforts) of significant contributions that demonstrate the nominee's leadership, dedication and initiative in executing the InfraGard mission **at the local level** over an extended period.
3. Please provide specific examples (programs, events, initiatives, or other efforts) of significant contributions that demonstrate the nominee's leadership, dedication and initiative in executing the InfraGard mission **at the national level** over an extended period.
4. Please provide specific examples of how the nominee successfully led by example and served as a role model, inspiring other stakeholders within the InfraGard program.
5. Please provide specific examples of earned recognition by other industry and trade groups, employers, and professional peers.

6. Please describe the specific and lasting outcomes/impacts of the nominee's contributions to InfraGard members and the InfraGard program, both locally and nationally. Outcomes should be addressed from both a quantitative and qualitative perspective.

IMA Leader of the Year Award / Ivan Wolkind IMA Leader of the Year Award

Nominations must describe how a nominee who holds a leadership position within an IMA has demonstrated an exemplary track record as a leader and made significant contributions to their IMA and the InfraGard program. The nomination must include measurable specifics (e.g., type/number of programs, initiatives, events, members served, or other efforts) to support each of the criteria.

Note: Recipients of the IMA Leader of the Year Award will automatically be considered finalists for the national Ivan Wolkind IMA Leader of the Year Award. This national award is named in honor of the memory of Ivan Wolkind, who served as Chairman of InfraGard National Members Alliance and dedicated six years of service to the national board.

1. Please describe the nominee's role within the IMA, including years of service.
2. Please provide specific, concrete examples (such as programs, events or initiatives) of how the nominee demonstrated outstanding leadership, initiative, innovation, and responsibility in executing the InfraGard mission to protect U.S. critical infrastructure and the American people.
3. Please provide specific examples of how the nominee demonstrated leadership and initiative in collaborating with the local FBI Field Office and other public or private sector partners to execute the InfraGard program.
4. Please provide specific examples of how the nominee successfully led by example and served as a role model, inspiring other stakeholders within the IMA (such as the board of directors, Sector Chiefs, members, etc.).

Sector Chief of the Year for Physical Security Award

Nominations must describe how the nominee has excelled as a Sector Chief and made significant contributions to their IMA, InfraGard members and the overall safety and security of their sector. The nomination must include measurable specifics (e.g., type/number of programs, initiatives, events, members served, or other efforts) to support each of the criteria.

Eligibility: This IMA Sector Chief of the Year Award for Physical Security is intended only for individuals who work in physical security.

1. What critical infrastructure sector does the nominee represent?
2. How long has the nominee served as a Sector chief?
3. Please provide specific, concrete examples of how the nominee demonstrated outstanding leadership as a Sector Chief and provided value to InfraGard members (sector-specific events, training exercises, outreach, etc.).
4. Please provide specific examples of how the nominee demonstrated leadership in collaborating with the local FBI Field Office and other public or private sector partners to facilitate sector-specific, two-way information sharing (presentations, threat briefings, reports, etc.).
5. Please provide specific examples of how the nominee contributed sector-specific subject matter expertise to strengthen the security of their sector overall (speaking engagements, webinars, participation in conferences and events, etc.).
